



Application deadline

International entry qualification - quota 1 and 2

Application deadline: March 15, 12 noon (CET)

Danish upper secondary education:

Quota 1: July 5, 12 noon (CET)

Quota 2: March 15, 12 noon (CET)

You must fulfill the following admission requirements:

- General admission requirement of an entry qualification
- Specific admission requirements for the bachelor's programmes
- Additional admission requirements

Specific admission requirements

Social Sciences

- English at Danish B-level
- Mathematics at Danish B-level
- History or Social Science or Contemporary History or History of Ideas at Danish B-level

Humanities

- English at Danish B-level
- History or Contemporary History or History of Ideas at Danish B-level
- One additional language
 - Beginners at Danish A-level
 - Advanced at Danish B-level

Natural Sciences

- English at Danish B-level
- Mathematics at Danish A-level
- One of the following subject combinations:
 - Physics at Danish B-level and Chemistry at Danish B-level
 - Physics at Danish B-level and Biotechnology at Danish A-level
 - Chemistry at Danish B-level and Geoscience at Danish A-level
 - Chemistry at Danish B-level, Biology at Danish A-level and Physics at Danish C-level

NB
English B must be passed with minimum one grade higher than the passing grade

Additional admission requirements

Applies for the following bachelor's subjects:

- Business studies
 - Informatics
 - International Studies
 - Chemistry
 - Molecular Biology
 - Environmental Biology
 - Physics
- Mathematics at Danish B-level
- Several options see ruc.dk

Please note:

As of the 2022 intake, RUC requires applicants of the **International Bachelor in Social Sciences** to fulfill a minimum grade requirement in order to be considered for admission.

Apply in Quota 1:

GPA equivalent to at least 6,0 on the Danish 7-point grading scale

Apply in Quota 2:

GPA equivalent to at least 6,0 OR 4,0 in English and Mathematics on the Danish 7-point grading scale

Selection quotas

Your application will go through the selection process in either quota 1 or quota 2

Quota 1 → selection based on your GPA only

Quota 2 → selection based on a overall assessment

Quota 1

- 1) You must fulfill the admission requirements
- 2) You must be certain that you fulfill the required GPA
- 3) Your GPA must be directly convertible to the Danish grading system

GPA required in quota 1:

Humanities: 8,0


Social Sciences: 8,0

Natural Sciences: Guaranteed admission if fulfill admission requirements

Quota 2

- 1) You must fulfill the admission requirements
- 2) You must have at least one study relevant qualification (academic and/or general qualifications) acquired after completion of your entry qualification
- 3) You must submit a motivational letter.

How to apply

You apply online at www.optagelse.dk

You must use the Danish title and admission area number → see ruc.dk

Remember all required documentation

How to apply

Remember to approve your application before the application deadline.

With Danish CPR number

- You apply and approve using NemID or digital signature

Without a Danish CPR number

- Print a signature page, sign it and send it to matriklen@ruc.dk

Process after submission

Make sure to check your e-mail frequently

RUC will assign you a personal mailbox at postbox.ruc.dk

Make sure to react quickly if RUC ask for additional/missing documentation

Process after submission

Application decision will be sent to you:

EU/EEA applicants – July 28

- Must accept/reject by August 6

Non EU applicants – June 1

- Must accept/reject by June 8
- Pay tuition fee by June 8

Process after submission

If you accept your offer, RUC will send you all relevant information, including information about the two week introduction programme in August


